I'd like to offer a massive thank you to each and everyone of you who have helped to make this the most successful fundraiser I've ever been involved with! But it's not just about the money: I've been really impressed

with the way in which so many people have been creative and come together to undertake all sorts of activities. This has helped to make more links in our communities and has allowed people to let their gifts shine. The idea for the Sowers and Reapers came from the parish, and the parish has really worked hard in making this a success. In the past few weeks we've had a curry night, cross-stitch sessions, wreath making, cup-cake baking, hill walking, the making and selling of gifts such as jewellery and cards, a Nigerian stall, the manufacture of pasteurised apple juice, and many other endeavours besides. I think we can all be rightly proud at what we have achieved.

Christmas Fair A lot of hard work went into putting together this year's Christmas Fair at St Padarn's and I'm very grateful for all those who gave so much of their time – especially as illness in the community (my own included) meant people covering each other's responsibilities: a great show of teamwork as everyone came together to make the event a success. While the event wasn't as well attended compared to previous years, the fair still managed to raise £433.50. A big thank goes out to all who supported this event in any way.

Diocesan Pilgrimage to San Giovanni Rotondo and Assisi Bishop Mark will be leading a five-day pilgrimage through the heart of Catholic Italy, walking in the footsteps of saints and encountering some of Christianity's most treasured shrines. Beginning in Pietrelcina, birthplace of Padre Pio, we'll journey through San Giovanni Rotondo, Lanciano's Eucharistic shrine, and the House of Loreto before spending time in Assisi, home to St Francis and St Clare. The Pilgrimage takes place from the 28th September – 2nd October, 2026. The cost is £1,275 per person sharing a twin/double room on a half-board basis.
